



United States Air Force Biography Lieutenant Colonel Kevin K. Y. Wong

Lieutenant Colonel Kevin Wong serves as a Joint Engineering Plans Officer, U.S. Pacific Command. He serves as the lead action officer for the \$10B USMC move to Guam and built the decisional Guam Integrated Military Development Plan brief, which CDRUSPACOM approved on 11 Jul 06. He oversees the command's \$1.6B plus MILCON program and writes the annual MILCON testimony to the Subcommittee on Military Quality of Life and Military Construction. He is responsible for all engineering issues for USPACOM forces based in the States (Hawaii, Alaska, and the West Coast) and U.S. territories (Guam and Wake)

Lt Col Wong was commissioned through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program in December 1987. His first assignment was as a programmer and electrical design engineer for the 3800th Civil Engineering Squadron, Maxwell AFB, Alabama. In 1990, he transferred to the 554th RED HORSE Squadron, Osan AB, Republic of Korea. As a project engineer, he led troop construction projects throughout the Pacific. In 1991, he served as an electrical engineer with the 823rd RED HORSE Squadron, Hurlburt Field, Florida. Once again, Lt Col Wong led troop construction projects throughout Southwest Asia and Ninth Air Force. In 1994, he became Chief of Maintenance Engineering at Mountain Home AFB, Idaho during the beddown of the composite wing. In 1997, he moved to the Headquarters Air Combat Command Civil Engineering Directorate, Langley AFB, Virginia, where he served as the Environmental Program Manager and as Chief, Command Operations and Maintenance Program. In 2000, he took a career broadening assignment to the Headquarters Pacific Air Forces Operations Directorate, Hickam AFB, Hawaii. Lt Col Wong served as a Headquarters Command Center Director and as the Flight Commander for the Pacific Rescue Coordination Center. In 2001, he transferred to the Civil Engineering Directorate as Chief, Facility Programs. He attended Air Command and Staff College in 2002. In 2003, he was the Commander, 366 Training Squadron, and Detachment 6 at Gulfport, Mississippi, which provided initial skills training to all AF structural troops. This summer, he will assume command of the 421st Civil Engineering Squadron at RAF Menwith Hill, England.

Lt Col Wong holds two masters degrees: a Master of Public Administration from the University of Oklahoma in 1998 and a Master of Military Operational Art and Science from Air University in 2002. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering from the University of Hawaii in 1987. His awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters, Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Air Force Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters, and the Air Force Achievement Medal.

Lt Col Wong was born in Honolulu, Hawaii. He is married to the former Bridie Schultz of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. He has a daughter, Noel, and a son, Kevin Jr.
